Sri Lanka Law College

Sri Lanka Law College situated in Hulftsdorp Street of Colombo, Sri Lanka, was established in 1874 under the then-one-year-old Council of Legal Education in order to impart a formal legal education to those who wished to become advocates and proctors in Ceylon.

The Sri Lanka Law College is the institution which has trained almost all the lawyers in Sri Lanka and it is the only gateway to the legal profession in the country. The history of training for the legal profession in Sri Lanka goes as far back as 1833, the year in which the Supreme Court was empowered by Section 17 of the Charter of 1833, to admit and enroll as Advocates and Proctors, persons of good repute and of competent knowledge and ability upon examination by one or more of the judges of the Supreme Court. This was done in order to provide sufficient legal practitioners to work in the judicial system established by the British Colonial administration.

In order to practice law in Sri Lanka a lawyer must be admitted and enrolled as an 'Attorneys-at-Law of the Supreme Court of Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka'. To receive admission to the Bar, a law student must complete law examinations held by Sri Lanka Law College.

Sri Lanka Law College conducts oratory competitions, mooting, workshops and boasts a strong Law Students' Union. Sri Lanka Law College conducts post graduate courses including a Master of Laws (LLM) from University of Wales and diplomas in Intellectual Property Law and International Trade Law.

The main building of Sri Lanka Law College was constructed in 1911 and the premises has an Auditorium, Library, Computer Room with IT facilities, Canteen, Bookshop, and lecture halls.

As one of the oldest professional training bodies it has trained all the lawyers in the country who have served not only in the field of law but also various other fields such as politics, social reforms, commerce, trade unions and religion.

Extradition in Sri Lanka is governed by the Extradition Law (No. 8 of 1977, as amended by Act 48 of 1999) and the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act (No. 25 of 2002) (MACMA).



Criminal Investigation Department (known as CID) is the primary investigative arm of the Sri Lanka Police and was established in 1870.

Question 6: Answer: 1

Sri Lanka and France both have Premier-presidential systems.

The president chooses the prime minister and cabinet, but only the parliament may remove them from office with a vote of no confidence. The president does not have the power to directly dismiss the prime minister or cabinet, but he/she can dissolve the parliament. Some of the other countries operates under this system are Egypt, Portugal, Poland etc.

The Chief Justice of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka is the head of the judiciary of Sri Lanka and the Supreme Court of Sri Lanka. Established in 1801, the first Chief Justice was Codrington Edmund Carrington. The 47th and current Chief Justice is Jayantha Jayasuriya. Sir Edwin Arthur Lewis Wijewardena was the 28th Chief Justice of Ceylon in 1949. He was the first Ceylonese to be appointed to the Post.

G.G. Ponnambalam was a Ceylon Tamil lawyer, politician, and cabinet minister. His decision to join the UNP led government in 1948 caused a split in the ACTC. Eventually, in December 1949, the ACTC dissidents, led by Chelvanayakam, C. Vanniasingam and E. M. V. Naganathan, formed the Illankai Tamil Arasu Kachchi (ITAK, Federal Party).

Edward Walter Perera was a Ceylonese barrister, politician, and freedom fighter. He was known as the "Lion of Kotte" and was a prominent figure in the Sri Lankan independence movement and a senator.

The flyover bridge built between Bambaranda and Wawurukannala is the highest and the longest railway flyover bridge in Sri Lanka.

There are 25 administrative districts organized into 9 provinces. Each district is administered under a District Secretary, who is appointed by the central government.

The country is divided into 22 electoral districts. 21 of the 22 electoral districts were conterminous with their namesake administrative district. The other electoral districts are Vanni and Jaffna. Vanni electoral district consists of the administrative districts of Mannar, Mullaitivu and Vavuniya and Jaffna electoral district consists of Kilinochchchi and Jaffna.

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

In 1959 she was arrested by the police in connection with the assassination of Prime Minister of Sri Lanka S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike, which led to her dismissal as Ceylon's Minister of Local Government. The charges against her were subsequently dropped in 1960.



The International Criminal Court (ICC or ICCt) is an intergovernmental organization and international tribunal that sits in The Hague, Netherlands.

The ICC is the first and only permanent international court with jurisdiction to prosecute individuals for the international crimes of genocide, crimes against humanity, war crimes, and the crime of aggression. It is intended to complement existing national judicial systems and it may therefore exercise its jurisdiction only when national courts are unwilling or unable to prosecute criminals. The ICC lacks universal territorial jurisdiction and may only investigate and prosecute crimes committed within member states, crimes committed by nationals of member states, or crimes in situations referred to the Court by the United Nations Security Council.
