# 1. General Information



## I. The Open University of Sri Lanka

The Open University of Sri Lanka (OUSL) was established in 1980 under the University Act No. 16 of 1978 and the OUSL Ordinance No 01 of 1990. It therefore has the same legal and academic status as any other national university in Sri Lanka. The OUSL is the only recognized university in Sri Lanka, where one can pursue higher education solely by distance education techniques in keeping with the philosophy of OPEN & DISTANCE LEARNING (ODL). The OUSL is an attractive choice of study, especially for those employed. The current student population is around 40,000. The OUSL offers courses/programmes from the Foundation and Certificate level through bachelor's to Masters and PhD degrees. Study programs are structured to give participants the chance to go up the ladder and enhance their educational credentials after completing one program. Thus, learning at OUSL is a lifetime experience. Via a network of locations dispersed over the island, the OUSL operates. The Open University's Central Campus and Colombo Regional Center are conveniently located in Nawala, Nugegoda, and are reachable by car and train. The University's academic divisions are organized into six faculties: Natural Sciences, Education, Engineering Technology, Health Sciences, Humanities and Social sciences, and Management.

## IV. The Study System

The OUSL's study system is built on approaches for remote learning. It's not the traditional study plan that most of you are used to. Since regular attendance at the

university is not necessary, it is ideal for those of you who have occupations or other responsibilities. Well-crafted printed course materials that are appropriate for independent study help students learn. Online and audiovisual resources are added to printed course materials. Assignment tests and final exams are two examples of the many assessment methods used to evaluate student progress in courses at various intervals. It is recommended that students register online for the final examination.



## **V. What are the Interactive Learning Sessions (ILS)?**

Interactive learning sessions provide you with an opportunity to get to know your teachers. For every course, a member of the academic staff is designated as the Module Leader (Course leader). These Department Faculty members are in charge of creating the course and making sure you have excellent educational experience. In all regional and study centers where Day Schools are held, students receive help from visiting academics who collaborate with the module leaders. Attending a day school allows you to talk to your academic advisor about your learning challenges and find solutions. Additionally, you may contact the Module Leader online at any time or schedule a meeting with them during their regular working hours.

## **VI. Courses, Course Codes, Credit Rating**

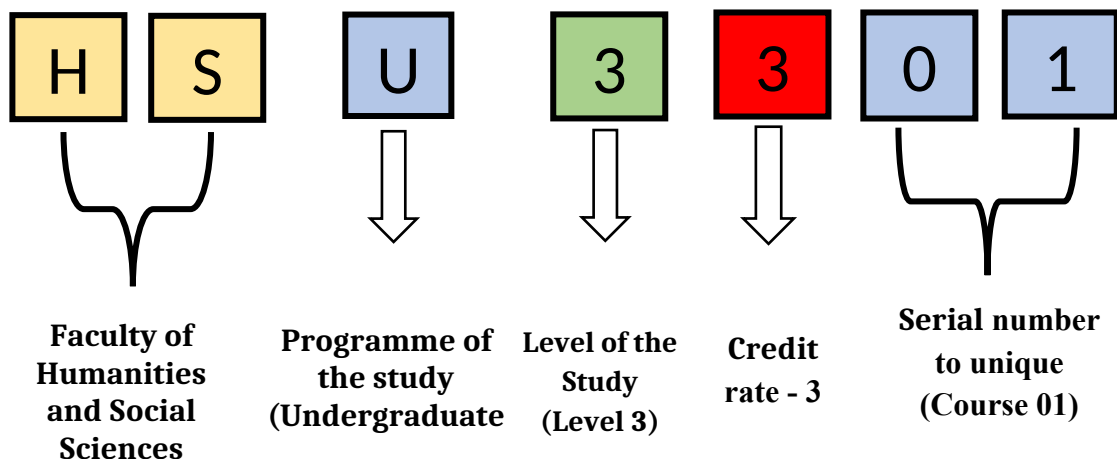
The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) offers courses at different levels.

Certificate level courses are at level 1 and 2, Diploma level courses are at level 3 and 4, Degree level courses are at Level 5 and 6.

Every courses are offered in English medium. The credit rating is the expression used to denote the 'academic value' of the course/programme. The time you will have to allocate for studying a course depends on its credit rating. Each course offered by the Faculty is assigned a course code. A course code reflects the subject area, level of study and the academic value of the course. In assigning the course code, the programme of study is identified by the letter and level of study is identified by the 4 digits. Incorporating all the above components, each course is assigned a course code consisting of 3 alphanumeric characters as shown in the example of a course code of the Diploma Library and Information Studies (HSU3301) programme.

## VIII. Library Facilities



The Open University of Sri Lanka offers excellent library services offered by the OUSL. The main library at Nawala is located on the central campus and is well-equipped with books and AV materials and other materials. In addition, the library is given access facility to past test papers collection, E-Resource collections (e-books, e-databases, e-journals). Photocopying services, interlibrary borrowing, and remote access to university-subscribed e-resources are another feature it offers. Further Library organize skills development programs for students and staff in different areas including research support. Matara, Anuradhapura, Kurunegala, Jaffna etc. The Main Library is open every day from 8.30 am to 6.00pm, except University vacations and Poya days. Regional libraries are open every day except Sunday and Monday.

## **IX. Print Material**

Print materials are the most important material in open and distance learning. Printed materials are documented according to the content of the courses. They are given to students at the registration time for self-study at any pace. It also provides a series of carefully designed self-assessment questions interspersed through the text. These guide the student towards an understanding of the material and help him /her to develop analytical skills and independent thoughts.

The Information Studies Unit (ISU) operates under the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) .It is located in the Main Library of the OUSL.

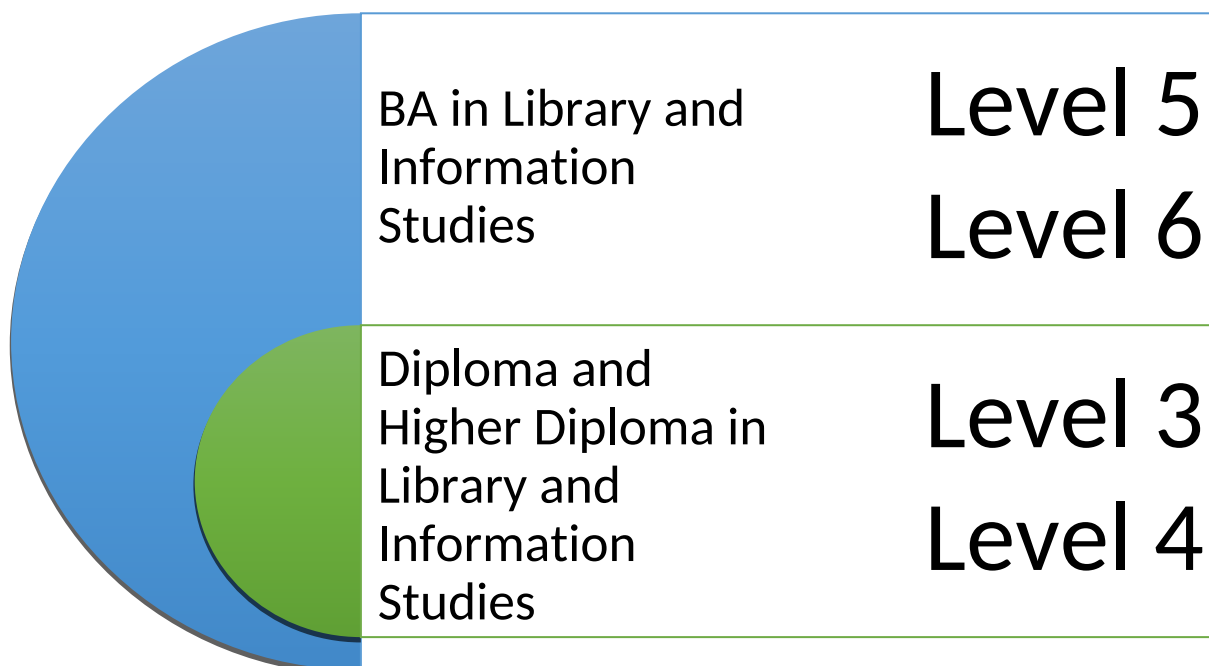


The Information Studies Unit engages in the preparation of lesson materials while coordinating the programme. The ISU will further perform the following functions under the instructions and guidance of the Faculty of HSS.

- a. Prepare study materials.
  - b. Prepare LMS
  - b. Organize, coordinate and conduct ILS (Day -Schools).
  - c. Counselling students in their academic matters.
  - d. Take action for conducting CAT/TMA and collecting marks etc.
- e. Equip students with skills to prepare a “Project Report” at level 6 by providing.
- i. Guidelines at ILS and
  - ii. Continuous supervision
- f. Evaluate Project Reports submitted by the students.
- g. Conduct Final Examination at the end of each academic year.
- h. Supervise and invigilate Final Examinations.
- i. Submit Continuous Assessment marks and Final Examination marks to Senior Assistant Registrar

### 3.Courses Offered

This section describes the types of programmes offered by the Information Studies Unit.



## **4. Degree programme -BA Honours in Library and Information Studies**

The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences offers BA Honours in Library and Information Studies. Students who registered for the above level 3 and level 4 have to sit 15 final year papers (first year -8 and second year 7). Once you complete level 3, you can get a Diploma certificate and when you complete both levels, level 3&4 you can get a Higher Diploma certificate. (Higher Diploma is an exit point of our programme. If you want to exit and later, you can join the degree programme). When you complete Level 5 and 6 you can get an honors degree in LIS, BA Honours in Library and Information Studies.

## **5. Entry requirements to BA Honours in Library and Information Studies**

The programme has two entry levels

### **Level 3 entry requirements**

- The Faculty of Humanities & Social Sciences accepts entrants to the programme from any subject stream of GCE (AL) with 3 passes. (For level 3).
- Equivalent to any Foundation course (SLQF Level 2) or (NVQ Level 4 ).

### **Level 5 entry requirements**

- Complete 60 credits in Diploma in Library and Information Science.
- Complete Higher Diploma in Library and Information Science at University of Kelaniya.
- Complete Higher Diploma in Sri Lanka Library Association.

## **6. Programme Duration**

The minimum duration to complete a Higher Diploma in the Library and Information Studies Programme will be two (02) academic years. The minimum duration to complete BA Honours in Library and Information Studies degree programme will be four (4) academic years.

## 7. Medium of Instruction

This programme is offered in English medium. The study materials will only be provided in English medium.

## 8. Programme Structure

This Higher Diploma is equivalent to Sri Lanka Qualifications Framework Level 4 (SLQF Level 4) and NVQ Level 6. It is structured as a two-year programme with four semesters. Students are required to earn a minimum of 60 credits to complete the Higher Diploma program.

Bachelor Honours is equivalent to Sri Lanka Qualifications Framework level 6 (SLQF Level 6). It is structured as a four-year programme with eight semesters. Students are required to earn a minimum of 120 + 4 credits to complete the BA honors in Library and Information Studies. The 4 credits include the compulsory English course which is call 'Englis for Academic Purposes'.

## 10. Assessment and Evaluation

There are two types of assessments at the programmes at OUSL. They are Continuous Assessments (CA) and Final Examinations.



### Continuous Assessments (CA)

Continuous assessment tests are used to evaluate your progress in a course on a regular basis. For each course, there may be many CAs. There are different types of CAs such as tutor mark assessment (TMA), Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), Close Book Tests (CBTs), Oral Presentations and particles. A percentage of your average mark from all the CA components (50%) will be included in your final grade.

Remember, failure to score the minimum stipulated CA marks will lead to overall failure of that course and you will not be allowed to sit for the final examination.

### Final Examination

At the end of each semester, you will have Final Examinations. If you fail to sit for a Final Examination, you will be required to re-sit for the examination in the subsequent year. If you get an FA grade, it means that you will have to register for that course once again. When you re-register for a subject, you will be required to pay for the course again.
